On February 12, 2021, the New York State Education Department (NYSEDE Department") submitted a waiver request to the United States Department of Education (USDE) on behalf of all Local Education Agencies (LEAs) in New York State seeking flexibilitym federal accountability requirements the 202021 schoolyear¹

Specifically, the waiver request addressed the unique circumstances caused by the ongoing pandemic. The Department argued that even in cases where databeout dected for the individual accountability indicators order to make determinations at the elementary/middle and high school levels, there is much concern that such determinations for the 1262bool year will be distorted by the disparities ass the State in learning modality and device/internet connectivity access. These disparities undermine the Department's ability to make accurate judgements about individual indicators and overall school and district performance, effectively negating the ability to meaningfully differentiate among schands oreffer appropriate supports.

ESSA Accountability Implications

Based on the waiver granted by USDE, NYSED will present propassed ndments to Commissioner's Regulations relatted accountability and schools in Receivershiphten Board of Regentsat its September 2021 meeting. Proposed amendments will be consistent with the following actions:

- x NYSED will waive all requirements pertaining to participation rate in state assessments administered during the 2020-schoolyear.
- x NYSED will not make 202122 school year accountability statusslevel determinations based on 202021 school year data foany of the indicators used in New York's accountability system composite performance; academic progress; student growth; English Language Proficiency; chronic absenteeism; graduation rate; and college, career, and civicreadiness.
- x NYSED will freeze the accountability status of all schools and districts and schools will have the same accountability status in the 2026 hool year that the districts and schools had in the 2026-school year. Therefore:
 - Any district that was identified as a Target District in the 2020school year will maintain that identification status in the 2022schoolyear.
