The United States and New York State Department Labor sets policies for the hours, times, and tasks that minors of different age groups are able to perform. Labor Standards will allow 4–15-year-old minor employed as part of a supervised work study or work experience program that is approved by the Commissioner of Education (such as GEWED work three hours on a school day and 23 hours a week instead of three hours a day and 18 hours a week under the WECEP programs noted on bothpage 8 and 13 of the P882 booklet

- 8. How many credits can students earn as part of GEWEP?

 Students can earn a maximum of three (3) credits for 900 hours of work experience throughout their high school career distributed as follows:
 - x A maximum of one unit of credit can be earned for GEWEP in grades 9 and 10.
 - x A maximum of two units of credit for GEWEP may be earned in grades 11 and up.
- 9. Who can supervise a GEWEP program?
 As it was with WECEP, a GEWEP program must be supervise in by use tional staff memberor school counselor who holds extension as either a Coordinator of Basked Learning Programs for Career Awareness or Coordinator of Basked Learning Programs for Career Development.
