To satisfy their responsibilities regarding **thre**vision of education to students in prekindergarten through gradevelve, "educational agencies" (as defined below) in Stateof New York collect and maintain certainersonally identifiable information from the education records of their students. As part of the Common Core Implementation Reform Act, Education Law §2-d requires that each education agency in the Stateof New York must develop a Parents Bill of Rights for DataPrivacy and Security (Parent Sill of Rights). 1. Must additional elements be included in the Parents' Bill of Rights.?

Yes. For purposes of further ensuring confidentiality and secofistudentialata, as an appendix to the Parents Bill of Rights each contract and ucational agency network with a third party contractor shall include the following supplemental information:

- (A) the exclusive purpose for which the student data, to ache for principal data, will be used;
- (B) how the third party contractor will ensutheat the subcontractors, personsentities that thethird party contractor will share the student data or teacher principal data with, if any, will abide by data protection and security equirements;
- (C) when the agreement with the third party contractor expires and what happens to the student data or teacher or principal data upon expiration of the ement;
- (D) if and how a parent, studeetigible student, teacheor principalmay challege the accuracy of the student dator teacheor principal data that collected; and
- (E) where the studendataor teacheror principaldatawill be stored (described n such a manneras to protect data security), at the security protection staken to ensure such data will be protected, including wheth such datawill be encrypted.
 - a. In addition, the Chief PrivacyOfficer, with input from parents and ther education and expert stakehold is sequired to develop additional ements of the Parents' Bill of Rights to be prescribed Regulations of the Commissioner.
- 2. What protections are required to be in place if aneducational agency contracts with a third party contractor to provide services, and the contract requires the disclosure of PII to the third party contractor?

Education Law§2-d provides/ery specific protections for contractions that "third party contractors", defined as person or entity, other an an educational agency, that receives studentdata otteacheror principaldata from an educational gencypursuant o a contractor other written agreement or purposes of providing services to such educational gency. The term "third party contractor" also includes an educational partnership organization at receives to and/orteacheror principal APPR data from

The FamilyEducational Rights and Privacyct (FERPA)affordsparents and students who are 18 years of age or olde ("eligible students") certain rights with spect to the student's ducation records. These rights re:
